## RULES for VISITORS



The Historical Botanical Garden La Concepción is an Asset of Cultural Interest protected by the Heritage Law, so visitors are requested to show the utmost respect and care in observing the Rules of Behavior.

Visitors are asked to contribute to the maintenance of the garden in perfect condition and to ensure that the visit is pleasant. Remember that the Botanical Garden is a museum of living beings, not a park or a playground. Please follow the rules to protect the plants and not disturb other visitors. You are in a place where there are ponds, lakes, slopes, inclines and roots, so be careful to avoid falling.

To this end, please comply with the following instructions:

- It's allowed to walk along the paths, without invading the landscaped areas.
- No activities are allowed, except for those organized and authorized by the Garden itself.
- The plants must be respected in their entirety, therefore it is not allowed to collect any part or fruit of them.
- Smoking is prohibited.
- Eat in the picnic areas, where you can have a snack or sandwich. It is not allowed to enter with coolers, nor the occupation of these spaces for celebrations or meetings.
- Please dispose of your garbage in the waste garbage cans.
- Access with bicycles, skates, balls or drones is not allowed.
- Children under 16 years of age must always be accompanied and supervised by adults.
- Access to reserved or properly marked areas or rooms is not allowed.
- Family or commercial photo shoots are only permitted upon request and payment of the corresponding fee.
- To access the exhibitions or the cafeteria, it is necessary to pay the entrance fee.
- There are complaint forms available to the public at the ticket office. You can also make complaints and suggestions through the official website of the City Council of Malaga, accessing through the QR code displayed at the box office.
- Dogs are allowed as long as they are kept on leashes and their owners comply with and sign the rules for access with dogs.
- The Environmental Sustainability Area may exercise the right of admission if the visitor does not comply with the established rules.
